When Mary and I were in Africa I used to get up very early and cycle up into the hills to watch the sunrise. We were there at a time of political tension, so to make a regular journey into the countryside I needed permission from the President's Office. But then, under a star-lit sky, I would cycle up a dust road until I reached the bank of the Mweri-hari River. There I would wait, the flat-topped acacia silhouetted against brightening sky, as the deep red sunrise began the day. Back in Scotland I kept the pattern going. I cycled down to Renfrew for the early-morning ferry to Yoker. couldn't rely, sadly, on seeing a bright red sunrise every morning.

But I came to know the little crowd of regulars who took that first ferry of the day, off to work in the Albion works or in John Brown's shipyard. Some had been crossing the river there for over 30 years. They had travelled on the chain-driven ferry, then on the big diesel ones, the Yoker Swan and the Renfrew Rose. Now there is a little aluminium landing craft, the Silver Swan. One of the ferrymen had worked on them all, and he too had been crossing the river for over 30 years.

They greeted a newcomer in a very friendly fashion. One gave me a pair of safety-goggles to keep the hail and snow out of my eyes in bad weather. All in all, their message to me was "Welcome aboard!"

My experience here at Orchardhill has been exactly the same. I arrived a newcomer, as a relative as most of the stranger to congregation. I am very grateful for the kindness shown to me from the start. It seems as though those same words have been uttered: "Welcome aboard!" I look forward to life of sharing in the the congregation in the coming weeks.
