Walk Steadily Through Difficulties

Dear members and friends of Orchardhill,

I've often been moved by books I've read. And three times I have written to an author because I have been so stirred by what they have written. Each time I have been fortunate enough to receive an answer, and with two of the authors I have had a longer correspondence.

The first time was when I had been a minister for about 10 years. I was overwhelmed by a complex of difficulties, and it seemed that all my beliefs were under threat. I read a short book, 'Night', by Elie Wiesel. Wiesel was born in a Hungarian ghetto in 1928, and at the age of 14 he was sent along with his family to the Nazi death camps of Auschwitz and Buchenwald. Within hours of their arrival at Auschwitz, Wiesel's mother and little sister were killed in the gas chambers and consigned to the furnace. Thus young Wiesel, who had developed a mystical faith in God, was thus confronted by cruelty and death. "Never shall I forget that night," he wrote, "the first night in camp, that has turned my life into one long night. Never shall I forget that smoke, those flames that consumed my faith for ever."

Somehow Wiesel survived until the camp was liberated in 1945, and he has lived as a writer, a witness to the horrors of the Holocaust. He calls himself an agnostic, yet he continues to focus on the essence of faith and on the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. His integrity moved me, and I wrote to him. I have corresponded with him in fragments during succeeding years. Keeping my eye on him has been a steadying influence for me.

When you go through times of difficulty you are very likely to catch sight of someone who walks steadily through difficulties far greater than yours. Keep your eye on them. It will have a steadying influence on you.

As many of you will remember, as part of the National Stewardship Campaign we at Orchardhill opted to adopt the Stewardship Season approach. For Orchardhill this means that in March each year we will look at one of the three aspects of Stewardship (Finance/Treasure, Talent, and Time) and focus on one specific area.

Last year we looked at Talent. While we should again take this opportunity to review our annual giving and think about the Talent we devote to God the focus this year is on Time.

Each Sunday in March, just after the offering, we will examine these questions and look at where we can direct our gifts, including time, as an offering to God. Please participate in this effort to think about these matters and include them in your prayers.

Orchardhill has received a letter of grateful thanks from the Church of Scotland HIV Programme for the donation of £57 from the retiring offering at one of our Communion Services. The programme is currently helping to fund 36 projects around the world in sub-Saharan Africa (Malawi, Kenya, Ghana, Nigeria, Zambia, Zimbabwe and Mozambique) and Asia (India, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, Thailand, Taiwan, China and Bangladesh) as well as in Egypt, Israel and Scotland.
