A Hard-won Privilege

Dear members of friends of Orchardhill,

The Nominating Committee, elected at the meeting after morning worship on Sunday 27 September, has now begun its work. At some time in the future they will bring to the congregation the name of a minister, a Sole Nominee, to be the next minister of Giffnock Orchardhill.

"Why does it all take so long?" I hear you ask! Well, it's a long story. At the heart of it is a congregation's right to select a minister of its own choice.

In 1712 an Act of Parliament established the right of Patronage in the Church of Scotland. This allowed the laird or other wealthy patron to install the minister in the local parish. This became a hotly debated topic within the Church. The Evangelicals within the Church of Scotland held that this undermined the spiritual independence of the whole Church as well as subjecting the people of local parishes to a minister who was likely to be over-sympathetic to the laird's interests.

This came into clear focus at the time of the Highland Clearances. Often a minister made no protest when his parishioners were forcibly removed from their crofts and livelihoods to make way for flocks of sheep which were more profitable for the landlord.

A number of developments around this issue divided the Church of Scotland deeply. The Moderates were content to let the State direct the Church's policy. The Evangelicals were determined to free the Church from the grip of "the establishment". So, in 1843, 470 of the Evangelical ministers, out of the Church of Scotland's 1200 ministers, broke away to form the Free Church. In this movement, called The Disruption, they abandoned their manses, their stipends and their security to ensure that no more could a laird impose a minister on their congregation. In the Free Church a congregation was now free to appoint a minister of their own choice.

By 1929 the Moderates were recognising that the congregation should be free to choose their minister, and the majority of the Free Church united with the established Church again. So our Nominating Committee carries the responsibility for selecting the most suitable minister for the congregation.

It takes time. But it is a hard-won privilege.

And a blessing.
