Remembrance

We have some greater knowledge of those whose names are recorded on the memorial to the fallen of the First World War from Orchardhill Parish Church. Thanks to detailed and lengthy investigation carried out by Jim Blair, more is known about each.

In many cases the regiment in which they served as well as the place and date on which they fell has been uncovered and is now recorded in a book retained in the church and freely available for consultation. Such details of family and local connections emphasise the truth, known but easily forgotten in the weight of numbers, that every life lost in war was that of someone precious to many others: a member of some family; a son, perhaps a brother or uncle, a husband or father.

In this centenary year of the Battles of Verdun, Jutland and the Somme, and one hundred years after the introduction of conscription we remember not only the vast numbers of lives lost but that each represents an individual who was profoundly connected to others.

Such connection was evident to those in this church at that time for servicemen wrote to the then Minister, Arthur Cowan, as Anna Blair notes in her history of Orchardhill. Their words do nothing to glorify the conflict; they paint a much more desperate picture. One wrote, "If the people at home had any idea of the hardships of our soldiers out here in this fiery ordeal they would see how great is the need for their prayers."

In our day we do well to remember those who still bear the consequences of conflict in their minds and bodies. It is right to remember families still grieving or who continue to struggle and not to overlook former service personnel who find the transition to civilian life impossibly difficult. In our remembering we look outward in our contemporary world and can imagine only a little of the hardships, suffering and sorrow endured by those in the "fiery ordeal" of Aleppo and in other places today. How great, still, is the need for our prayers for those who suffered in war and those who continue to do so and for those who endeavour to bring peace.

Orchardhill Graves

Seven Orchardhill men, including two brothers, Robert and Douglas Haldane, are named on the First World War memorials in Faubourg D'Amiens Cemetery in Arras, France. A photograph of the latter's grave, with a cross and poppy, is published on the front page of this edition.

The Haldane brothers are listed on the Arras Memorial, as are John Gray, James McGregor, R Shirley Scott, and Thomas Toshak. Another Orchardhill man, David Leed, is named on the Arras Flying Services Memorial.

The cross and poppy were placed at Douglas Haldane's grave by Jim Blair. As reported in June's *Orchardhill Record*, Jim has been researching the graves of those named on the memorial plaque in Orchardhill's Tower Vestibule. His researches are now published in a memorial book.

On Wednesday 23 November Rev Peter Macdonald, leader of the Iona Community, will speak about "The Iona Community Transforming Lives to Change the World, the work of the Iona Community, and the challenges of the future". Come along to learn about the Iona Community which, as a radical movement and organisation, is committed to living out the Christian faith in the areas of:

- Environmental stewardship
- Peacemaking and non-violence
- Healing and reconciliation
- Hospitality, diversity and inclusive community
- Worship, faith and spirituality
- Social justice and human rights
- Politics and campaigning
- Gender justice and human sexuality

The Community actively and urgently seeks to work in partnership with all people of goodwill who share their commitment to just and non-violent action, irrespective of nationality, religion or political creed.

Following the well-received TED Talks of last year's programme, this session's event will feature Jody Williams and Scilla Elworthy giving lectures, respectively "A Realistic Vision for World Peace" and "Fighting with Nonviolence". These will take place on Thursday 2 February.

Finally, on Thursday 9 March, Very Rev John Miller, former Moderator of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, returns to Orchardhill to deliver his lecture on "What Shall We Tell the Grandchildren?"
