### Anyone for Desert?

This may be a time of year when we plan how to spend warm, summer days in sunny spots overseas or actively exploring some of the world's historic treasures. Among the various offerings in travel agent brochures, though, you're unlikely to find sojourning in the Sahara or camping in the Kalahari. Perhaps unsurprisingly, deserts don't really float our holiday boat! It's not that we dislike sand, particularly if it is sun-soaked and beside the sea. So why are deserts unpopular tourist locations? It's probably because they are, well, deserted. Dry. Barren.

Lent is approaching, that time when we remember Jesus spent 40 days in the wilderness of Judea. The Evangelists connect this event with the 40 years spent by the Hebrews who, having fled through the Red Sea from oppression in Egypt, wander until a generation died out and relied each day on God's providing what the desert, in its barrenness, could not. Both for the people of Israel and for Christ, desert seems to be a place of patient preparation, but it is not a permanent residence.

It is therefore alarming to recognise that the world's deserts are growing. Land degradation affects one quarter of the world's population, around 1.5 billion. Increasing numbers of people are discovering that there once fertile fields have become a wilderness. The desert is engulfing the lands which once sustained them.

In the lenten desert, Jesus was tempted to turn stones into bread. Later, in the Lord's Prayer, he encourages his disciples to pray for their daily bread: "Give us, this day, our daily bread." This may mean that where our daily bread, our enjoyment of the Earth's resources result in other people going without food, water or security then we are not living up to the vision we take on our lips in prayer. If Lent is a period of re-aligning ourselves with the priorities of God's kingdom seen in Jesus, then perhaps this Lent may usefully be a time to recognise the desert challenge which is literally faced by many. And perhaps the fruit of a period of personal reflection, though not merely private introspection, may enable us live more generously towards others, and towards God. For we believe God works in us, individually and together, to produce fruit which will not only endure but which will increase to the benefit of many.

# Contributing to Ministry

"Each one must give as he has decided in his own heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." 2 CORINTHIANS 9: 7

Within Orchardhill we require to make a contribution to our ministry - locally, in Scotland and beyond. We do this by giving of our time, our talents, and our money.

As far as monetary donations are concerned the most common ways are via standing orders or weekly freewill offering (WFO) envelopes. Standing orders are an arrangement with your bank to give a specific sum, usually monthly. This is a very secure system and only needs a simple form to be completed. WFO envelopes provide an opportunity to contribute weekly, and the amounts are known only to the WFO treasurer. Giving through the open bag each week is, of course, always an option.

Also, you can increase the amount you give to the Church by 25% at no extra cost to you! Through the Government's Gift Aid scheme, if you are a UK tax payer, Orchardhill can reclaim the tax on your giving. This can be used in conjunction with your standing order, WFO envelope or other specific donations. All you have to do is sign a simple declaration form, and for every £1 you give Orchardhill will be able to claim a further 25p.

Regardless of how you choose to give, if you haven't done so recently, why not give some prayerful consideration to reviewing your givings and help sustain the ongoing work of our Church?

## Hyderabad Visitors Welcomed

After weeks of hassle and doubt Glasgow Presbytery's visitors from the Diocese of Hyderabad have been to Scotland. The most pleasing aspect of their visit was that they came in full strength. Two who had initially been refused visas were able to join the Bishop of Hyderabad, Rt Rev Kaleen John, and his wife. The four were warmly welcomed to Glasgow Presbytery's meeting in Pollokshields Parish Church on Tuesday 14 February.

Bishop John not only thanked Glasgow Presbytery and others in the Church of Scotland for hosting the visit. But he also related some of the Diocese's work in and around the Hyderabad area, providing assistance to the marginalised communities, not only for Christians but also for all faith groups. That succour extends to those afflicted by the likes of HIV/Aids.

Yet that work is being done in an atmosphere of antagonism that is, at times, brutal and murderous. Through our own media we hear occasionally of the more extreme examples of the victimisation of Christians, not only in Pakistan but elsewhere on the sub-continent. But it is all the more realistic when it was here at home from the voice of one who has experienced it and yet leads a community willing to turn the other cheek and to continue to offer helping hands.

### First for Church of Scotland

Rev Aquila Singh, the Church of Scotland's first Asian female minister, was among those welcomed to Glasgow Presbytery last month following her induction to Fernhill and Cathkin Parish Church in Rutherglen in January. Though born in Pakistan, she has lived in Scotland since she was two, and she was a teacher at Belmont House School in Newton Mearns before her ministry training.

### Presbytery Moderator

Rev Ian Galloway, Minister of Gorbals Parish Church, is to be Glasgow Presbytery's next Moderator. He will take over from Rev Jeanne Roddick at Presbytery's June meeting.

The Moderator Designate is currently convener of Presbytery's Superintendence Committee and a former convener of the General Assembly's Church and Society Council.

His wife, Rev Cathy Galloway, is about to retire as head of Christian Aid Scotland. Her successor will be the current Church and Society Council convener, Rev Sally Foster-Fulton, who will step down as Associate Minister at Dunblane Cathedral at the end of this month.
