Palm Sunday was the deadline, and as the eggs were counted a cheer went up. Another egg had been donated – to take our total this year to 200!

Thank you! This says something important about the generosity of members (and some others in our community). It reminds us that our young people can give us an enlivening vision. And it means that when we know what we're trying to do and how we might get there we can indeed make noticeable progress!

I therefore want to encourage you to take part in another venture to do just that – on a slightly larger scale. The Kirk Session will meet in early June to begin to focus our thinking on what we are about as a congregation and what, consequently, we hope to do together here and in our community. After some work over the summer, the plan is that we'll take a full day together on Saturday 2 September as a whole congregation, and perhaps some time on the following Sunday afternoon, too, to work out what we might do, and how we will use our God-given abilities and resources to meet the hopes and needs of those around us. In short, how we will be people led by God in Christ to serve here and beyond in the coming few years.

I hope you'll be willing to take part and that as a first step you'll arrange to keep that weekend free. I hope, too, that you'll make your contribution, share your ideas and your expertise. Then, together, we will think and plan - and put some of it rapidly into action.

This Easter we've seen there is much potential. Every Easter we remember that we trust in a God of new life and beginnings and of limitless possibility. There is power in purpose, not least when it is shared in joint endeavour and shot through with the Spirit's energising.

May God bless you this Easter and long after and lead us together into greater service.



Covenanters Close to Home

Main events of the Covenanting years were well away from us here in Giffnock – the battles of Philiphaugh and Dunbar, the executions by drowning in Wigtown Bay, public hangings in the Edinburgh Grassmarket, incarceration on the Bass Rock or in Dunnottar Castle. But this month in 1678 the opposition struck a group of Covenanters close enough to have been seen from the tower of Orchardhill – if our church building had existed then.

On 12 May a large conventicle had gathered beside Williamwood House: the preachers were Rev John Campbell and Rev Matthew Crawford. But the service was raided by soldiers. More than 50 Covenanters were arrested. They were tried in Glasgow, and most of them were sentenced to banishment. That was punishment which was effectively slavery in the colonies, the eastern states of America and the Caribbean islands.

These were troublesome years for those dedicated to the Church of Scotland around 340 years ago!
