Follow me.

The Church of Scotland shall, in a few weeks time at the General Assembly, have another bite at the cherry of determining how to address the future. Faced with a diminishing number of members, ministers and resources, last year's strategic plan was considered insufficiently radical and the body which had produced it was told to go away and think again.

It has done this; the Presbytery held a conference here in Orchardhill recently to help members digest it, and the whole matter shall be debated at the Church's national gathering on the Mound later in May.

It starts and finishes with one of the simplest, and yet most challenging, of Jesus' phrases. 'Follow me.' Jesus spoke those words several times, but perhaps the best remembered occasion is on the beach by the Sea of Galilee early one morning over breakfast. Jesus speaks directly to Peter, recently restored after denying any association with Jesus on the night of his arrest and trial. The risen Lord indicates to the burly fisherman that the road ahead for him shall not be straightforward. Even so, his command is clear: 'Follow me!'

Seventy-five years ago, Jane Haining who was matron in the Church's Jewish Mission and school in Budapest, felt God calling her to return there from a holiday in Scotland. Her church line managers warned her not to go back, for the situation was too dangerous. She was unequivocal: Jesus called her to follow him in days of darkness for her girls, and not only when things were easy. She returned, was arrested and died only a few months later in Auschwitz.

We may not be called to serve with such selfless devotion in the face of danger and death. We are, though, called to follow Christ not as some historic hero but as a presently-living Lord who looks to us to co-operate with him to build his kingdom of justice and joy, life and hope and peace.

He leads us in all sorts of ways and in all sorts of places. He asks us in these days of our living, at this challenging time for our Church, to follow him. As that simple phrase bookends a significant report for our denomination, may it support our faithful living for Christ in these days.



Senior Badminton

Orchardhill Badminton Club had a successful 2018/19 season, with all competitive teams exceeding the results from the previous year. The club has four competitive teams, taking part in two different leagues across Glasgow and the Southside.

Our 1st Mixed team competes in the Glasgow Churches Badminton League. After a hard-fought season, the team placed second in their division narrowly missing out on a promotion — but came out as runners up in the Jack Trophy, where all competitive teams in the league compete against one another to win the cup. Our other Glasgow Churches entrants, Gents Doubles team, also had a successful season and a reversal of fortunes compared to the year before. Finishing second in the league, this was of great relief to all players as the team had finished bottom of the league in 2017/18.

As part of the Langside League, we have two teams taking part - Ladies Doubles and Mixed Doubles. The Ladies Doubles team were on track to win the league until the final night of the season, narrowly losing out in games to our friends at Old Parish in East Kilbride. Our Mixed team, however, went on to win their division and will be promoted to the first division for the 2019/20 season. The season culminated for the Mixed Team winning The Henderson Cup at the National Badminton Academy in Scotstoun, beating Newlands South by one game.

We held our AGM at the end of March, which also included the climax of our Singles Championships. Helen Black was crowned the Ladies Champion with Alex Fletcher as runner up. Andy Gall was crowned Gents Champion with Keegan Friel as runner up.

Outwith our competitive games, the club continues to thrive and provides a friendly, welcoming atmosphere for all members. This included our annual social night out in February, finished off with the regular annual quiz at Casa Byrne (Pat and Judy Byrne's home). A total of 20 club members will be taking part in the annual Thornlee Tournament, taking place in April/May — in a variety of singles and doubles tournaments against other badminton clubs in the Langside League. The finals will be taking place in Orchardhill's Memorial Halls on Saturday 11 May.

The successes of this season for all teams involved means the pressure will be high to maintain the winning formula for the year ahead. However, with a thriving club - including 8 new members joining this season alone - we look forward to meeting the challenges ahead!
